The comfortably furnished lounge and dining areas, as well as the seven double staterooms are spacious, bright and fully air-conditioned with individual temperature controls.

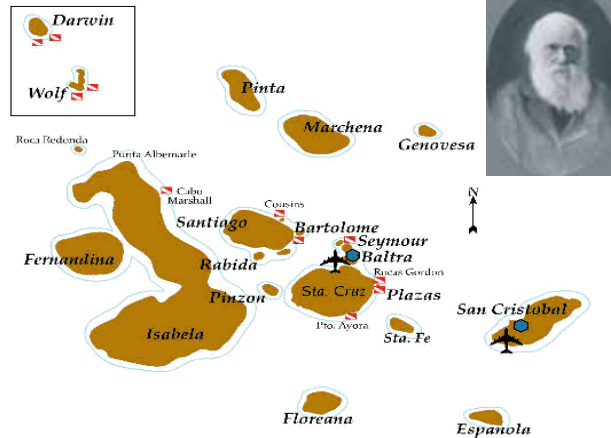
Personal Amenities

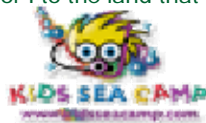
Galapagos



When you step off the plane in Galapagos, you are entering magical world. The "Enchanted Islands" of Galapagos are found in the Pacific Ocean 600 miles west of Ecuador. Made famous by the studies of Charles Darwin that became his "Theory of Evolution" the volcanic islands of Galapagos have been declared a National Park of Ecuador and the second largest Marine Reserve in the world.

The Galapagos Islands were formed 3-5 million years ago by a combination of tectonic forces and volcanic eruptions. Due to their remote location, the islands remained undisturbed for millions of years.

Today, Galapagos is home to more than 5,000 different species, featuring an amazing diversity of indigenous animals, many endemic. Many of these animals are unusually tame due to lack of predation and many years of protection. Come along with Kids Sea Camp and Galapagos Aggressor I to the land that time has forgotten.

Animal Life



Galapagos is home to many unique, endemic animals, most of which you will see on our scheduled land tours.

These animals are fearless due to the lack of natural predators. One of the best known, the giant tortoise, has evolved into fourteen distinct forms on the different islands of the archipelago. Other reptiles include the marine iguana which grazes on seaweed, land iguanas, lava lizards and geckos.

Among the endemic sea birds we will encounter and observe are a flightless cormorant, two species of gull, and the only penguin species which lives in tropical waters. The waved albatross breeds solely on the Espanola Island, while colonies of blue-footed, red-footed, and masked boobies are found alongside frigate birds.

We will snorkel with sea lions and fur seals that are found around the coasts and dolphins, whales and sea turtles are also commonly seen. Over 300 species of fish have already been described from the rich ocean waters around the archipelago. We will be in search of the whale shark during this adventure and will hope to dive with them off Darwin and Wolf islands.

All schedules, activities, and package inclusions are subject to changes. Package cannot be broken apart and no unused portions are refundable. All payments are nonrefundable. \$1000 deposit is required for booking. Trip cancellation insurance is highly recommended.



Sample Itinerary:

Wednesday: Overnight hotel stay in Guayaquil

Thursday: Morning flight to San Cristobal, Galapagos Islands. Guests are met at the San Cristobal airport and transferred to the boat. Your luggage is taken aboard by the crew. Once aboard, the Captain gives a detailed welcome aboard and safety briefing. An afternoon checkout dive is offered.

Friday through Tuesday: The journey to Wolf and Darwin Islands begins with stops along the way at Seymour, Bartolome, and Santiago. Guided land tours are offered throughout the week. Mid-week guests have the rare opportunity to snorkel with penguins.

Wednesday: Diving ends mid-morning. The vessel arrives at Puerto Ayora, Santa Cruz Islands. A visit to Charles Darwin Research Station is recommended. Shopping is available in Puerto Ayora. The Captain hosts a cocktail party on board at 6:00pm. Guests are shuttled ashore for dinner at a local restaurant.

Thursday: After a full breakfast, guests will checkout and they are then transferred to the local airport for the flight to mainland Ecuador.

- Scuba diving (youth 10 and over- must be certified.)
- Fish and coral I.D. Galapagos animal I.D.
- Beach Combing, seashore creature I.D. and clean-up
- Small boat handling and Nitrox course available.

- Underwater and Top side photography and video
- Water safety and water oriented games
- Local culture and customs and many land tours
